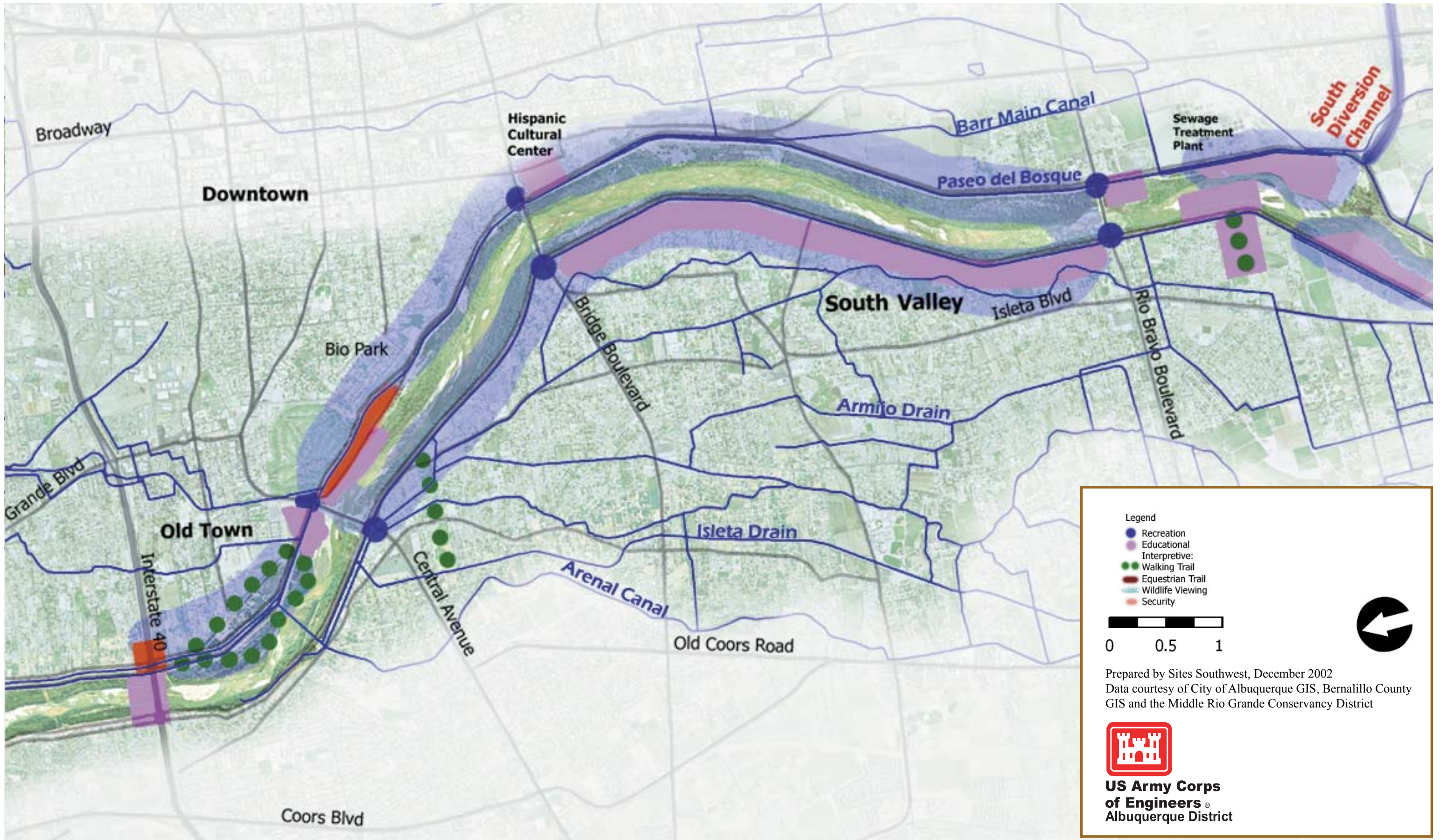


Community Recreation Input
 Community members were also asked to map priority areas for passive recreational activities. Trails of various types and for various uses were identified, as well as areas in need of access. Also, of note was the interest in wildlife viewing and other interpretive areas. Places to interact directly with the water, whether through boat access or fishing were also called out in a number of instances. Currently, there are only a couple places where fishing is supported, and no places where you can easily put in boats or canoes
